Getting around in Copenhagen

- Metro** The Metro runs 24/7. There are 2 lines and you can easily change to e.g. S-trains at some stations. Take the Metro from Terminal 3 in the airport directly to the city centre (3 zones, approx. DKK 36).
- Trains** The S-trains run from 5AM to 12:30AM. 24/7 in weekends. There are 7 lines connecting all of Copenhagen. It works really well and each stop is clearly displayed and announced onboard.
- Buses** The A-buses run 24/7. There are busstops at almost each street and it's easy to use. You're welcome to ask the driver to announce a certain stop. You can also take the harbour buses (yellow boats).
- Taxi** Taxi rides can be quite expensive so most people use public transportation. Taxis are safe and you can pay by card in all of them. All prices include tips. From Copenhagen airport (terminal 2+3) to the city centre it's approx. DKK 250.
- Tickets** Buy tickets for public transportation in machines at most stations. You can also buy the Copenhagen Card (tourist advantage card) which includes free transportation: www.all-copenhagen-apartments/sightseeing



Inner city

The heart of wonderful Copenhagen



Inner city

This is the historic, geographic and political heart of Copenhagen.

The city centre is at the City Hall Square, and in this area you will find Strøget (pedestrian shopping street), Parliament, Nyhavn, Amalienborg Palace etc.

If you want to stay in the very heart of Copenhagen with all major attractions within walking distance this is your area. Car parking is difficult and expensive though but public transportation is easy to use.

So much to see in the city centre



Copenhagen City Hall - This is the city centre and the very busy square where you also can experience all kinds of events throughout the year. You can also visit the city hall - don't miss the view from the tower!

➤ *Rådhuspladsen 1, 1550 København V - City*



Strøget - one of the longest pedestrian shopping streets in Europe. It's car free and a 1.1 km stroll from the City Hall Square to the Kongens Nytorv Square. We can also recommend shopping in the side streets.

► *Rådhuspladsen 55, 1550 København V - City*



Nyhavn - In English "New Harbour". At this 17th-century canal you will find many restaurants and bars and a great outdoor atmosphere especially during summer. Many canal tours also operate from Nyhavn.

Amalienborg Palace - The Royal palace and home of the Queen. Every day at 12 noon you can see the changing of the guards, and at the museum you can experience the royal life past and present.

► *Amalienborg Slotsplads, 1257 København K - City*



Christiansborg Palace - houses the Danish Parliament. You can get a guided tour and also see the Royal Reception Rooms, the castle ruins and even eat lunch in the tower restaurant.

► *Prins Jørgens Gård 1, 1218 København K - City*



Kongens Have - In English "Kings Garden". The oldest and most visited park in central Copenhagen. Enjoy life on the lawns and visit Rosenborg Castle, the home of the crown jewels.

► *Gothersgade 11, 1123 København K - City*



Canal tours - A great way of exploring the city centre is by boat. Jump on one of the many canal tours and get a great view of Copenhagen from the sea side.

► *Nyhavn 3, 1051 København K - City*



The Black Diamond - This is the Royal Library right at the harbour front. Enjoy great architecture and grab a coffee in the café or eat in the restaurant with a great view to the harbour.

► *Søren Kierkegaards Plads 1, 1221 København K - City*



The Round Tower - built by King Christian IV between 1637-1642. It was the first part of the Trinitatis Complex, which combined church, library and observatory in a single building. Great views from the top floor!

► *Købmagergade 52A, 1150 København K - City*



The National Museum - Denmark's most important and largest cultural and historical museum hosts a broad variety of fascinating exhibitions. A true time-machine with Vikings and Egyptian mummies.

► *Vestergade 10, 1471 København K - City*



The National Gallery of Denmark - Delve into 700 years of art and art history. Experience art ranging from the early Renaissance to the cutting-edge contemporary.

► *Sølvgade 48-50, 1307 København K - City*



The Botanical Garden - a part of the Natural History Museum of Denmark, at the University of Copenhagen, and holds the largest Danish collection of living plants.

► *Øster Farimagsgade 2B, 1353 København K - City*



The Marble Church - The circular nave is app. 46 metres high (app. 150 feet) and 12 pillars carry the dome which has a diameter of 31 metres (app. 100 feet). This places it among the largest of its kind in Europe.

► *Frederiksgade 4, 1265 København K - City*



Thorvaldsens Museum - Nowhere else in the world can you experience all the works of art by the Danish artist Bertel Thorvaldsen (1770-1844) than at Thorvaldsens Museum.

► *Bertel Thorvaldsens Plads 2, København K - City*



Torvehallerne - The great food market in Copenhagen with more than 60 stands. Here you will find fresh fish, gourmet treats, cheese etc. and a lot of small places where you eat and drink.

Christianshavn

Bohemian atmosphere at the canals



Christianshavn

Artificial island founded in the early 17th century with inspiration from Dutch canal cities. Today a lively part of the city with a bohemian atmosphere around the old and charming buildings.

At Christianshavn you will find the canals, Christiania, Our Saviours Church, Opera House, the world famous Restaurant Noma etc.

Classic Copenhagen area with a mix of trendy students, bohemian types, hippies and retired workers, and the area is within walking distance to Copenhagen city centre.

What to see at Christianshavn



The canals – Life is great on a summer day at the canals! Jump on a canal tour or simply enjoy the relaxed atmosphere. You will also find a lot of great cafés along the canals.

► *Torvegade 45, 1400 København K – Christianshavn*



Vor Frelzers Kirke - In English "Our Saviours Church". This large baroque church is one of Denmark's major tourist attractions. 90 metres high and 400 steps to the tower top floor with amazing views of the city.

► *Sankt Annæ Gade 29, 1416 København K - **Christianshavn***



Christiania - covers an area of more than 85 acres and houses almost one thousand inhabitants, but every year, more than a million people visit the Freetown.

► *Prinsessegade, 1440 København K - **Christianshavn***



Christianshavns Vold – a former rampart which was a part of the bastioned fortification ring which used to surround Copenhagen. Today a beautiful green recreational area, great for a walk or running.

► *Christianshavns Voldgade 54, 1424 København K - **Christianshavn***



Copenhagen Opera – The Royal Danish Opera is Scandinavia's leading opera company with a long tradition and history. In 2005, the Royal Danish Opera inaugurated its beautiful waterside Opera House.

Vesterbro

Home of the world famous Tivoli Gardens and the Central Station



Vesterbro

Formerly a working class area which today is one of the hottest neighborhoods with theaters, restaurants, cafes, bars, nightclubs and shops. Hotel area around Central Station.

In this area you will find Tivoli Gardens, Central Station, Istedgade, Kødbyen, Tycho Brahe Planetarium, Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek etc.

Vesterbro is a great area if you enjoy the urban city life, the cultural scene and meeting all kinds of people, and want the city centre within walking distance.

Our recommendations at Vesterbro



The Tivoli Gardens - fairy tale like experiences for all ages. Enjoy the many flowers, try one of the rides or dine at one of the fine restaurants in the Gardens.

► *Vesterbrogade 3, 1630 København V - Vesterbro*



Kødbyen - in English: "The Meat City". This is the old Meat Packing District. Today it houses cool restaurants, shops, bars, markets and galleries with a cool atmosphere.

► *Flæsketorvet 68, 1711 København V - Vesterbro*



Tycho Brahe Planetarium - The exhibition is a great place for space exploration - without ever having to leave the Earth. Amazing exhibitions, 3D and IMAX movies.

► *Gl. Kongevej 10, 1610 København V - Vesterbro*



Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek- an art museum of international stature in the centre of Copenhagen. The Glyptotek houses over 10,000 works of art divided up into two collections.

► *Dantes Plads 7, 1556 København V - Vesterbro*



Værnedamsvej - on the border between the Vesterbro and Frederiksberg areas you will find this true gem; Copenhagen's little Paris. A charming street with speciality shops, cafés and restaurants.

Visit Carlsberg - the Copenhagen Exbeerience. Enjoy beer tasting, horse carriage rides, guided tours, Carl Jacobsens magnificent art collection and the unique architecture of the old brewery.

► *Gamle Carlsberg Vej 11, 1799 København V - Vesterbro*



Fisketorvet Copenhagen Mall - one of Denmark's largest shopping centres with over 100 shops and restaurants. It's located at the harbor front only 5 min. from the city centre.

► *Dybbølsbro Station / Havneholmen 5, 1561 København V - Vesterbro*



Halmtorvet - in English: "The Haymarket". This old square houses a lot of great cafés and restaurants. During summer you can eat and drink outside in a very relaxed atmosphere.

Kalvebod Bølge - in English: "Kalvebod Waves". Between the Langebro bridge and the Bernstoffsgade street at the harbor front you will find this venue for water sports and sun bathing.

Nørrebro

Vintage shops, ethnic restaurants and living by the lakes



Nørrebro

The multi-cultural part of Copenhagen with lots of small design shops and ethnic restaurants.

At Nørrebro you will find the lakes, the historic Assistens Cemetery (H.C. Andersen), Sankt Hans Torv square etc.

In this area there's a lot of great restaurants from all over the world and small design and vintage shops. Nørrebro is a multi-cultural area with families, students, immigrants and hipsters.

Nørrebro sights



The lakes – The entrance to Nørrebro. At Peblinge Sø (Sø means Lake) you can enjoy life at the lake shore, grab a coffee or eat at one of the many good cafés and restaurants. Also ideal for a walk or running.

Sankt Hans Torv – At the Sct. Hans Square you will find many great restaurants, bars and cafés, e.g. Sebastopol. It's a lively square especially during summer time with people eating and drinking outdoors.

► *Sankt Hans Torv 32, 2200 København N – **Nørrebro***



Assistens Cemetary – Established in 1760 and a historic place with the tombs of H.C. Andersen, Søren Kierkegaard, Niels Bohr. Locals also use it as a park and in summer you will see people sunbathing here!

► *Kapelvej 4, 2200 København N – **Nørrebro***



Jægersborggade – Charming street with 40 specialty shops, selling everything from food, coffee, wine, clothes and a handful of studios where designers, potters, artists etc. create and sell their work.

Ravnsborggade – At the end of Nørrebrogade, by the lakes, you will find the cozy and lively Ravensborggade street with a trendy mix of small designers shops, cafes and restaurants.

Østerbro

Home of The Little Mermaid



Østerbro

Compared with other areas in Copenhagen this is the family/posh part of city and in general a more quiet area.

Østerbro is the home of The Little Mermaid, the lakes, the national stadium Parken, Fælledparken park, Kastellet (citadel) etc.

Nice family friendly area with lots of shops and some of Copenhagen's best cafés. Close to the lakes and green areas and yet easy to get to the city centre with public transportation.

What to see at Østerbro



The Little Mermaid – This is a true Must-See in Copenhagen. Based on the Hans Christian Andersen fairy tale this beautiful – and small – bronze statue has been a major attraction since 1913.

► *Langelinie, 2100 København Ø – Østerbro*



The Citadel - This is one of the best preserved star fortresses in Northern Europe. It houses various military activities but it mainly serves as a public park and a historic site. Guided tours possible.

➤ *Gl. Hovedvagt, Kastellet 1, 2100 København Ø - Østerbro*



Gefion Fountain – Beautiful fountain which features large-scale group of animal figures being driven by the legendary Norse goddess, Gefjun. It's the largest monument in Copenhagen, and also a wishing well.

➤ *Churchillparken, 2100 København Ø - Østerbro*



Zoological Museum– With more than 10 million specimens the museum has representatives of an estimated 10% of the global fauna. See magnificent mammoth and enormous whale skeletons.

➤ *Universitetsparken 15, 2100 København Ø - Østerbro*



Fælledparken– With 11 mio. visitors every year this park is the most visited in Copenhagen. Go for a walk, put on your running shoes, play soccer or visit the largest skatepark in Northern Europe.

Frederiksberg

Wild animals, romantic garden landscaping and shopping



Frederiksberg

Nice residential area with a mix of villas and charming buildings close to parks and green areas.

In this area you will find Frederiksberg Garden, Copenhagen Zoo, Royal Copenhagen factory, Frederiksberg Palace, Forum etc.

Frederiksberg is a really nice family friendly area with lots of parks, green areas and shopping. The architecture around Frederiksberg Allé is like Paris.

Must-see at Frederiksberg



Copenhagen Zoo – Elephants, polar bears, lions, penguins, rhinos, monkeys, giraffes... you will find them all in Copenhagen Zoo. Founded in 1859 and visited by 1.2 mio. tourists every year.

➤ Roskildevej 32, 2000 Frederiksberg – **Frederiksberg**



Frederiksberg Garden – one of the largest and most attractive greenspaces in Copenhagen. Enjoy a romantic landscape garden designed in the English style. Established in the 1690s.

➤ *Frederiksberg Runddel, 2000 Frederiksberg – **Frederiksberg***



Frederiksberg Palace – King Frederik 4's summer palace overlooking Frederiksberg Garden. Since 1869 the home of the Royal Danish Army Officers Academy. Guided tours on the last Saturday of the month.

➤ *Roskildevej 28A, 2000 Frederiksberg – **Frederiksberg***



Royal Copenhagen – Founded in 1775 and one of the the world's oldest companies. The original porcelain factory was located here, today you can shop in the Factory Outlet (mainstore is located in the inner city).

➤ *Søndre Fasanvej 9, 2000 Frederiksberg – **Frederiksberg***



Cisternerne – The Cisterns, a long forgotten subterranean reservoir, once contained the supply of drinking water for the Danish capital. Today acting as a venue for art exhibitions and other events.

➤ *Søndermarken, 2000 Frederiksberg – **Frederiksberg***

Living at the Copenhagen harbour



Islands Brygge

Relaxed and cool area by Langebro bridge with lots of life on the waterfront, especially during the summer months.

Islands Brygge is the place to be if you want to stay in a relaxed and cool atmosphere close to the water 10-15 min. walk from the City Hall Square (city centre) and Tivoli Gardens.

During the summer months the harbour front becomes an urban beach area with lots of cultural and sports activities.

Our recommendations at Islands Brygge



The Harbourbath – Enjoy open air swimming in the city centre. The water is clean and the quality is checked every day. Free entrance. In front of the pool you will find a lawn for picnic, sunbathing etc.

The harbourfront - Take a stroll at the harbour front, a former industrial area which today is a recreational area. During summer it becomes an urban beach with lots of activities and picnics at the lawns.

► *Islands Brygge 18, 2300 København S - Islands Brygge*



Bryggebroen - This bridge is solely for pedestrians and cyclists and connects Islands Brygge with Vesterbro on the other side of the harbour. There's a lot of great new architecture in this area.

► *Islands Brygge 71, 2300 København S - Islands Brygge*



Kulturhuset Islands Brygge - Right at the harbour front you will find the Islands Brygge culture house; over 350 annually events and a good restaurant with outdoor seating during summer.

► *Islands Brygge 18, 2300 København S - Islands Brygge*



Casino Copenhagen - You will find the largest international casino in northern Europe at the Radisson Blu Scandinavia Hotel. Classic casino games, tournaments, slot machines etc.

At Amager you will find a mix of typical working class areas, villa areas, large beach villas and new modern architecture around Ørestad.

Explore Amager Strandpark beach, The National Aquarium, Amager Fælled park, Koncerthuset (DR Concert hall), Copenhagen Airport etc.

You can stay close to the city centre in the northern part around Christianshavn and Islands Brygge. If you prefer staying close to the beach choose the Amager Strandpark beach area. Or stay closer to the airport. With the Metro you easily get downtown.

Our recommendations at Amager



Den Blå Planet – In English "The Blue Planet". The National Aquarium in Denmark is Northern Europe's largest aquarium with thousands of animals and seven million liters of water.

► *Kastrup Station / Jacob Fortlingsvej 1, 2770 Kastrup – Amager*



Amager Strandpark beach – 4.6 km. of beach along the Øresund coast, green areas, a beach island and a lagoon. Rent a kayak, take a dip in the ocean, a game of minigolf, or have yourself a nice meal.

► Øresund St. + Amager Strand St. / Amager Strandvej, 2300 København S – **Amager**



Amager Fælled – Previously used as a military training area. Today it's a green area with lots of wild nature, and a very popular place for locals to go for a walk, running, mountain biking, picnics etc.

► DR Byen St. / Ørestads Boulevard, 2300 København S – **Amager**



Koncerthuset – "The Concert House". Jean Nouvel's unique building puts Copenhagen on a level with other cities around the world which provide the best modern acoustic and visual setting for concertgoers.

► DR Byen St. / Ørestads Boulevard 13, 2300 København S – **Amager**



Field's – The biggest shopping centre in Denmark and one of the largest in Scandinavia. It's located in the new Ørestad area, at Ørestad Station and houses more than 140 shops, restaurants and cafés.
